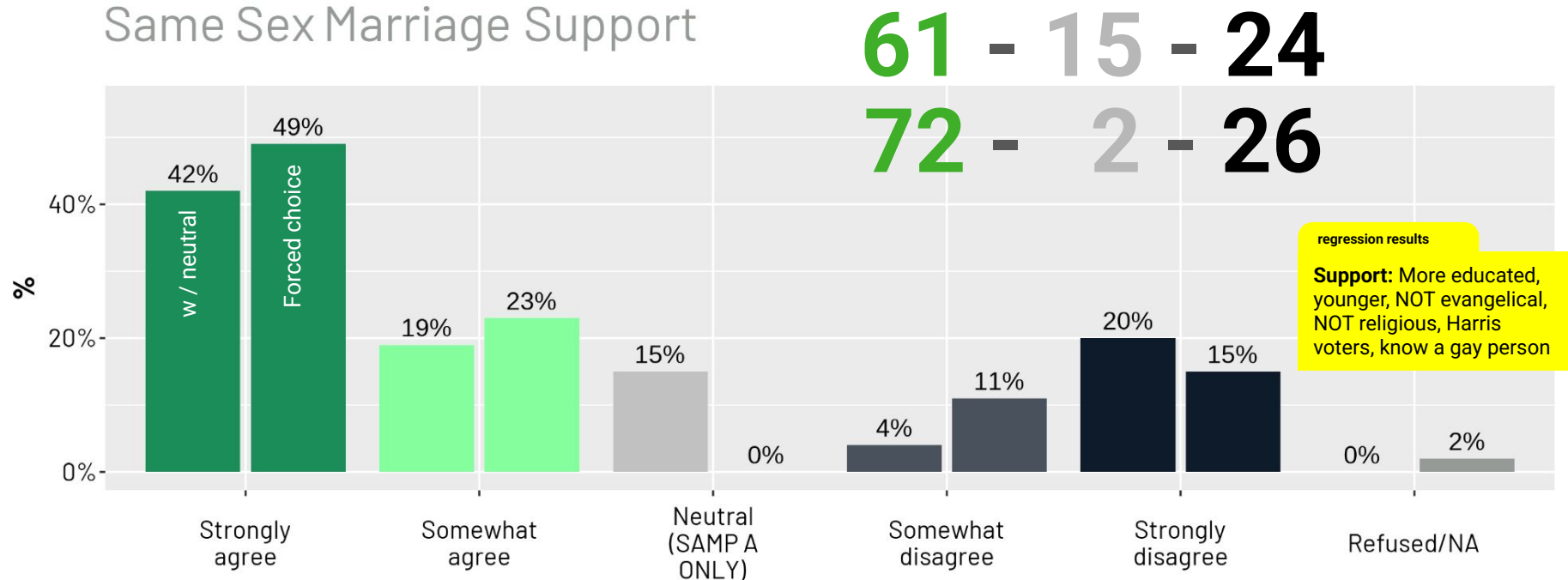


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- Support for Same Sex Marriage is Strong, Stable & Settled

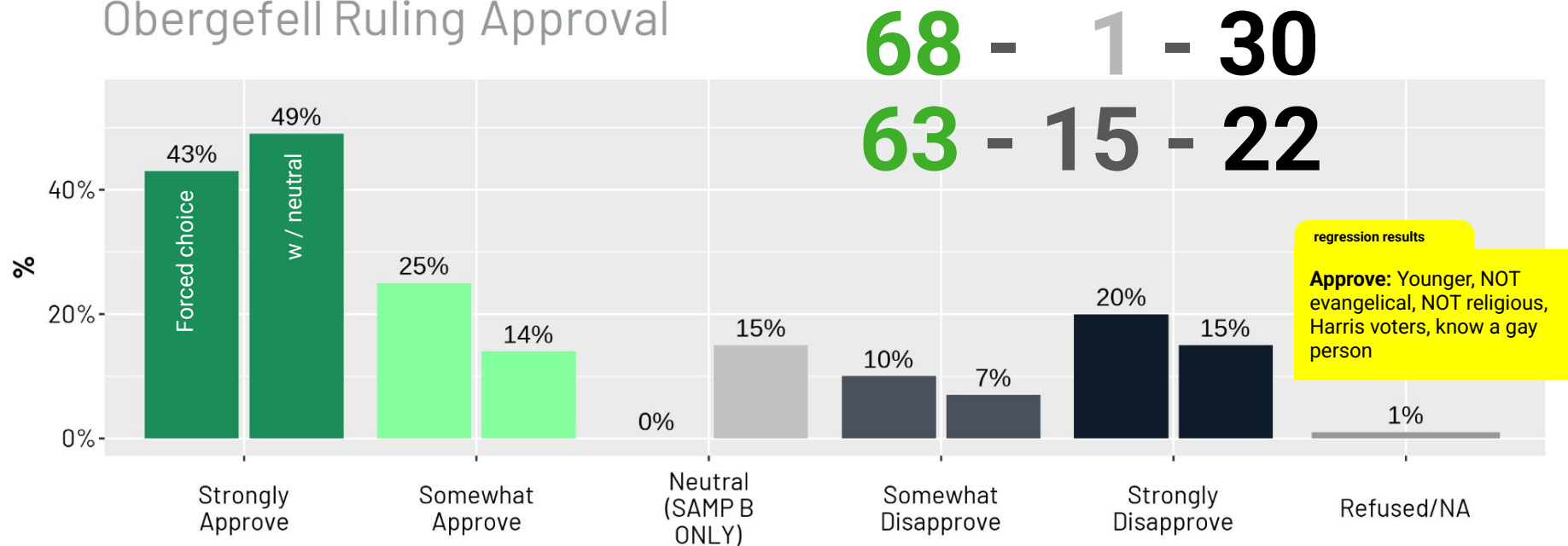

Two-Thirds Approval for SCOTUS Ruling Guaranteeing a Right to SSM

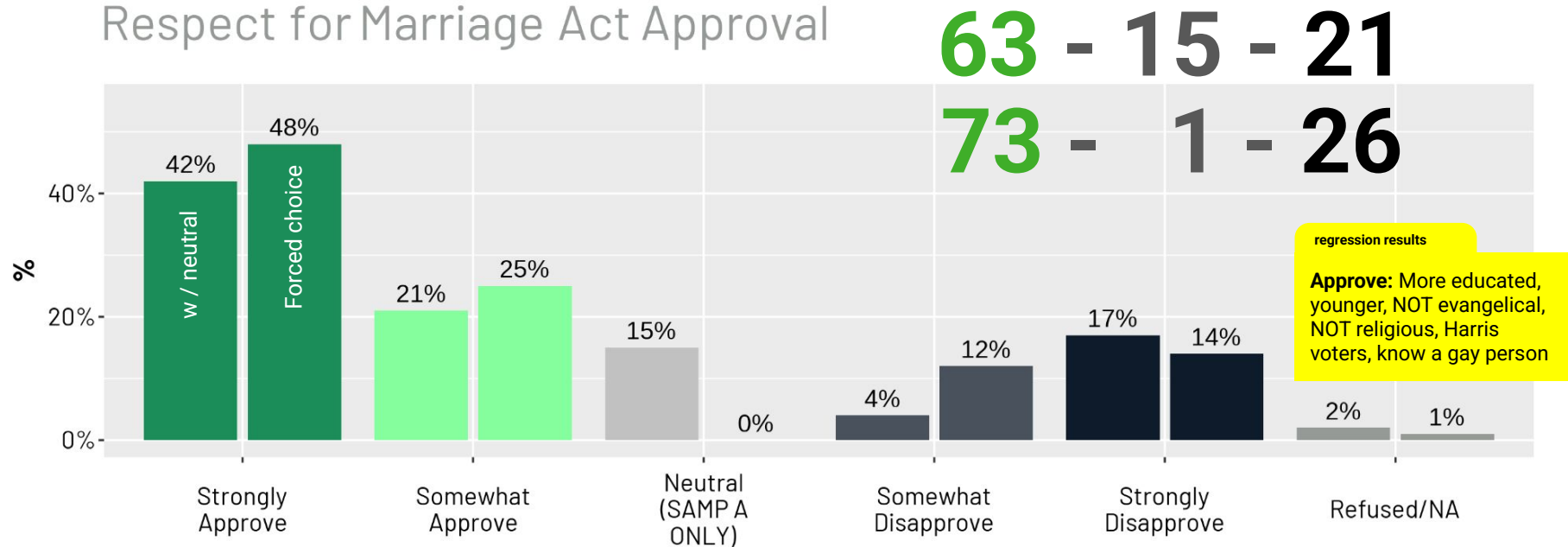
Obergefell Ruling Approval

Incredible 70% + Approval of the Respect For Marriage Act Without Neutral Option

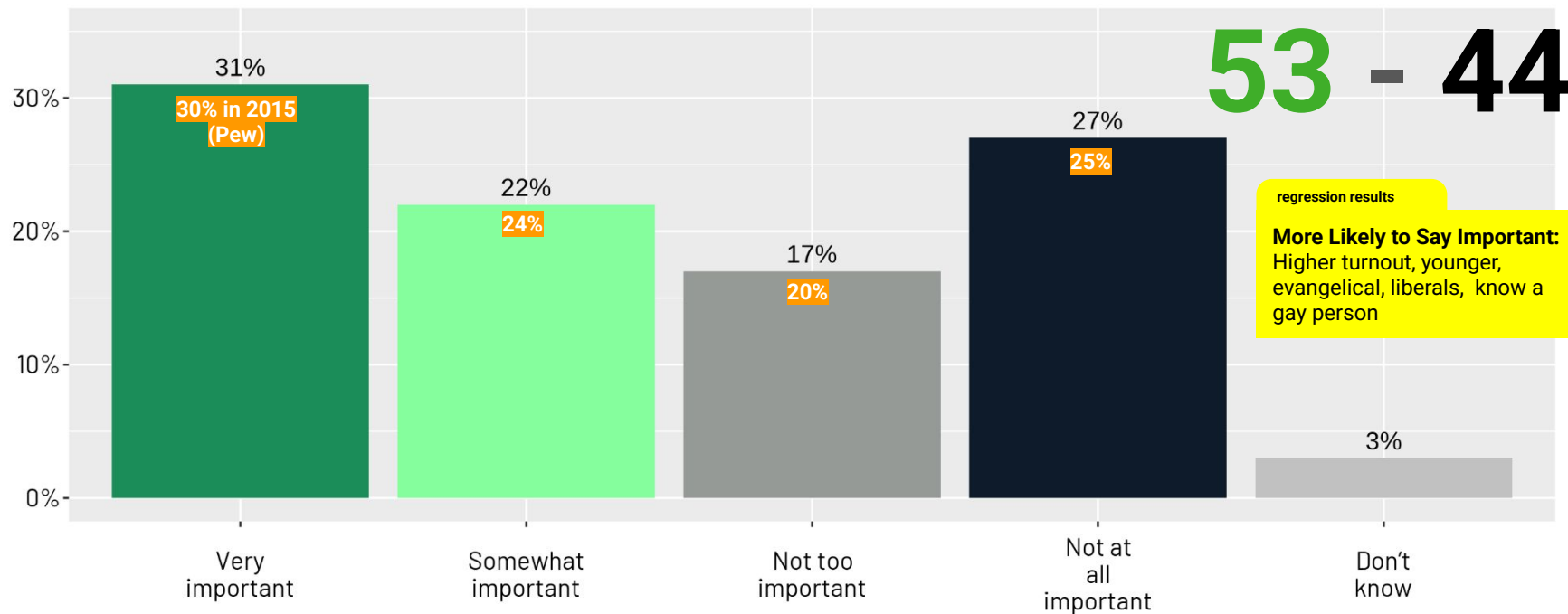
Respect for Marriage Act Approval

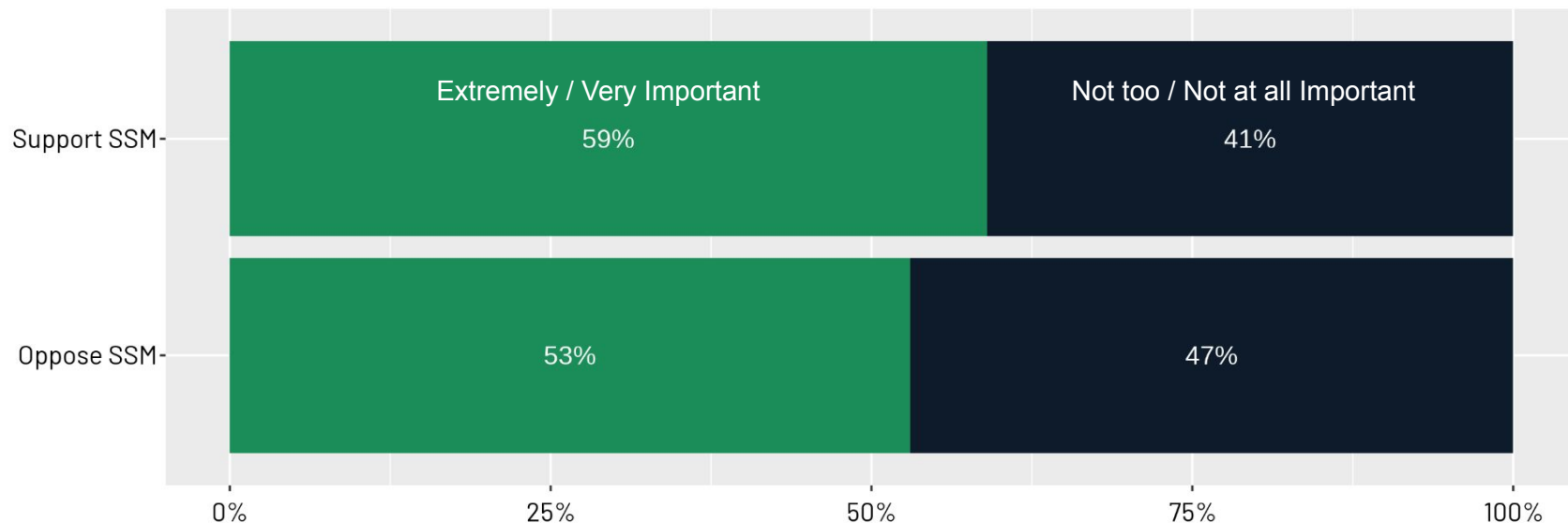
Same Sex Marriage Importance

Same Sex Marriage Importance by SSM Support

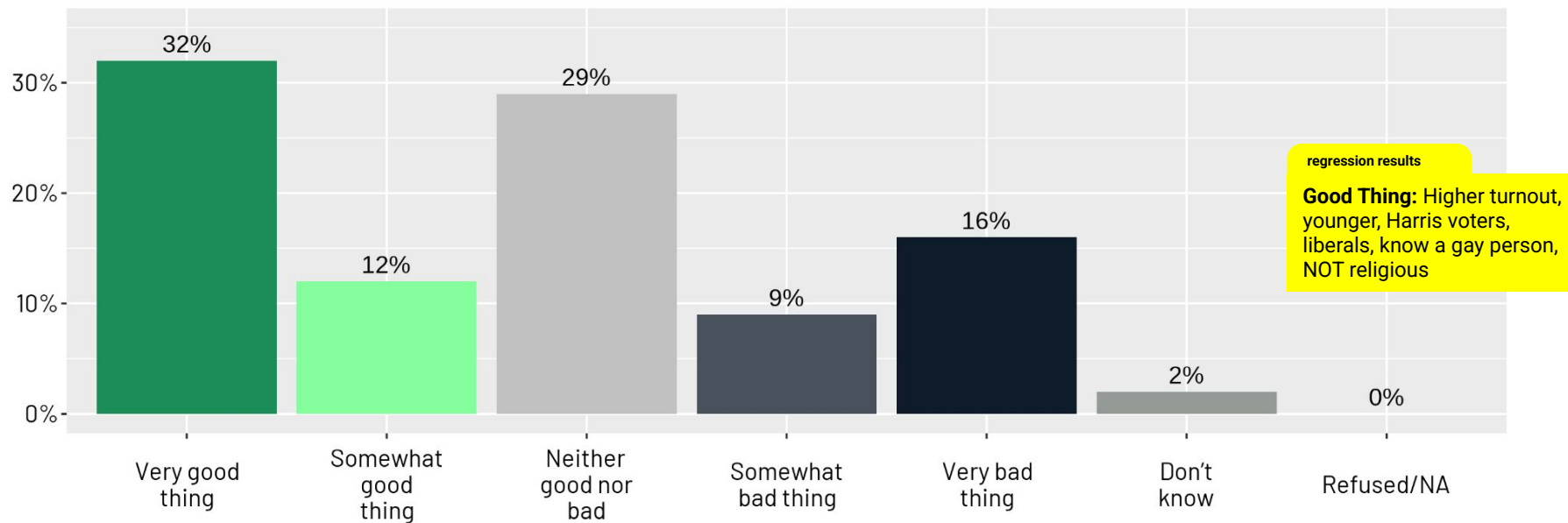

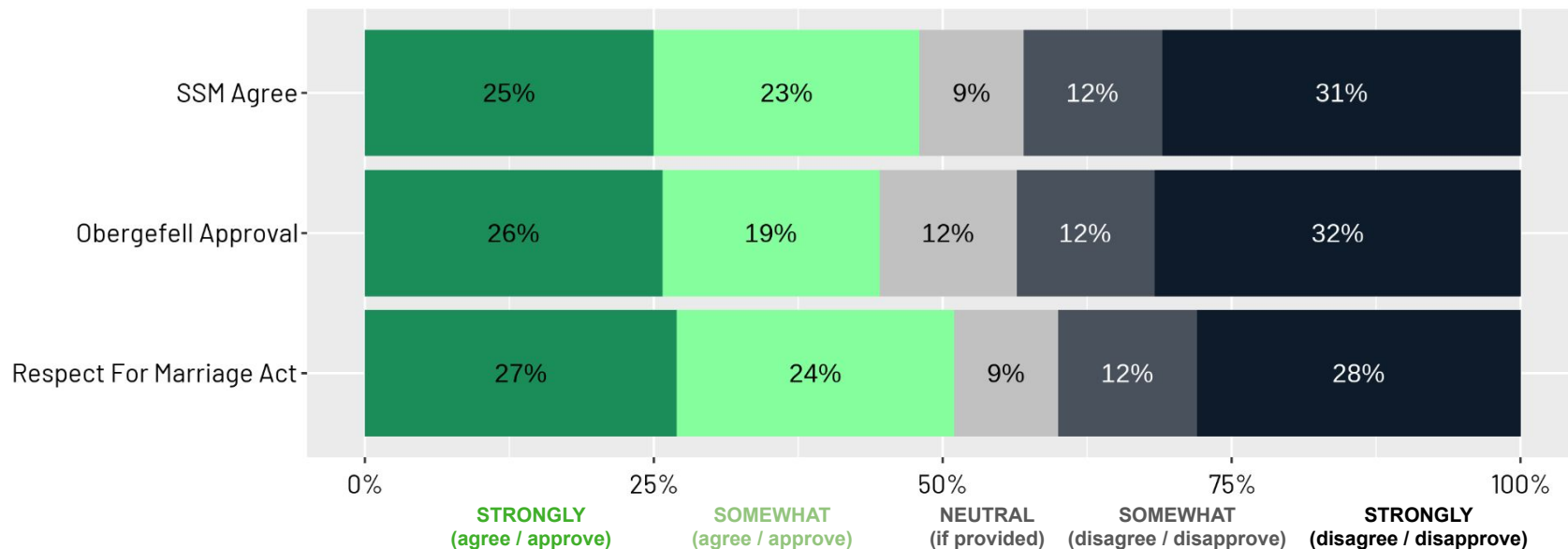

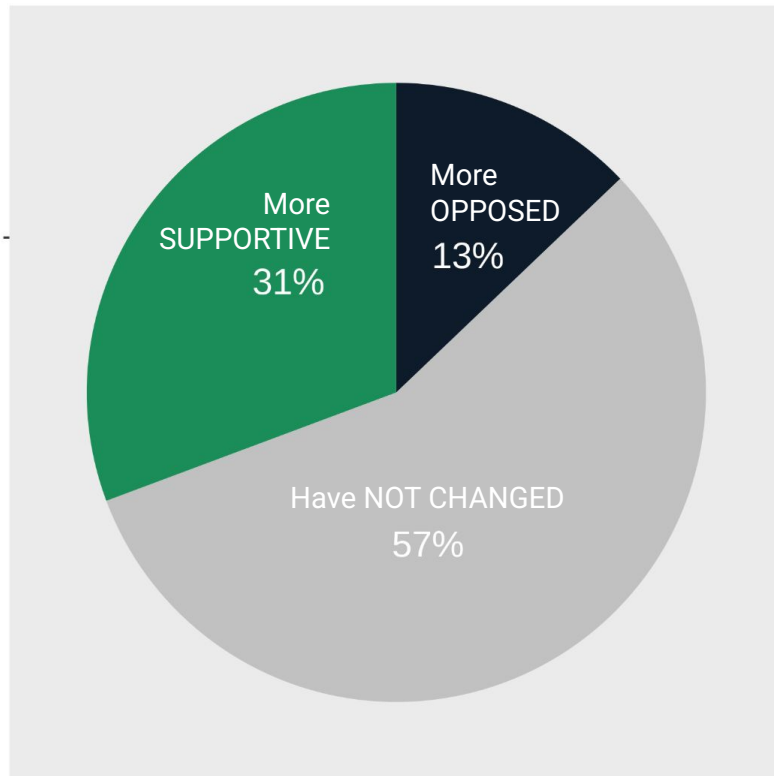

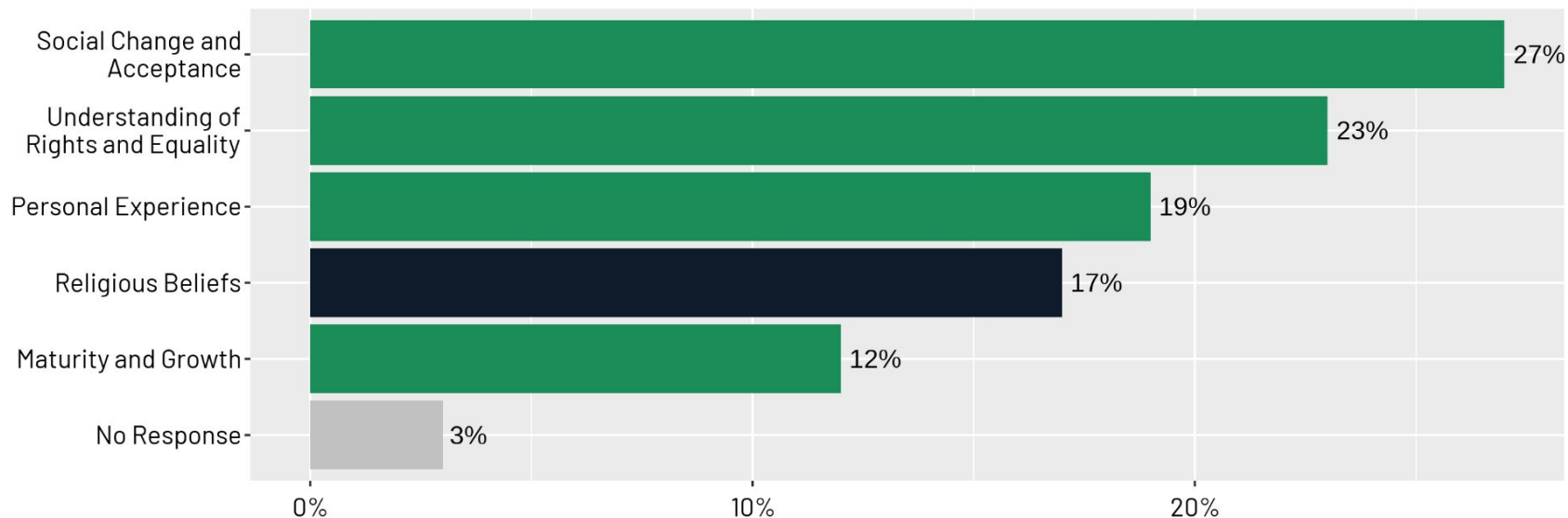

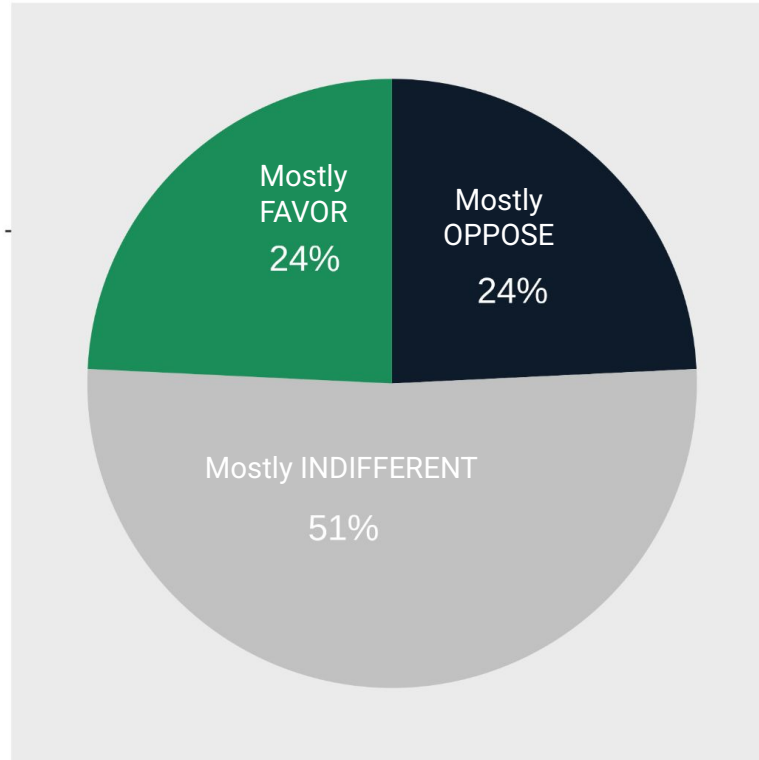

Perceptions of American Views on SSM



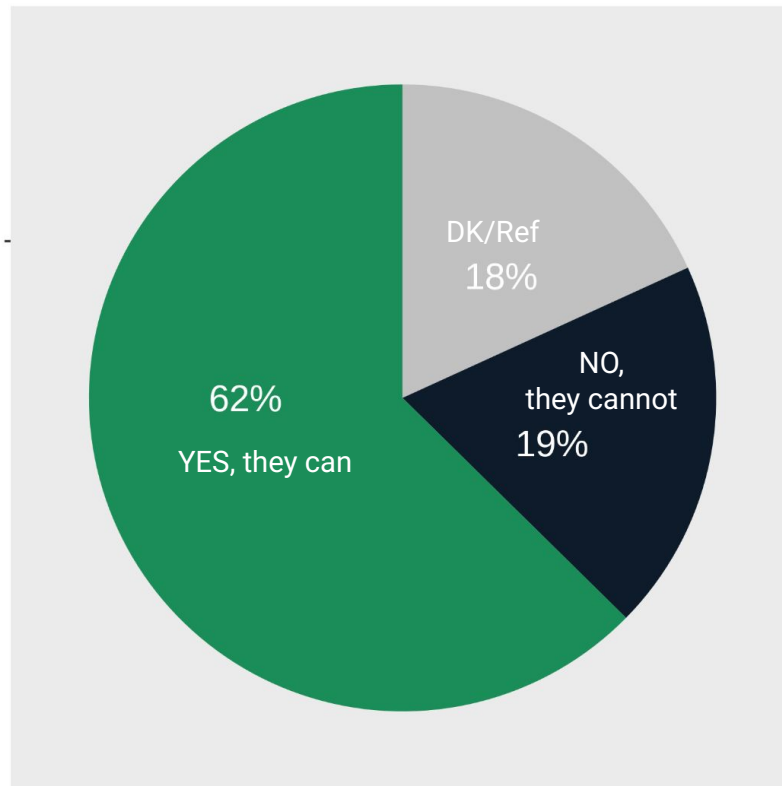

Self-Identified GOP on Whether Pro-SSM Can be Republicans



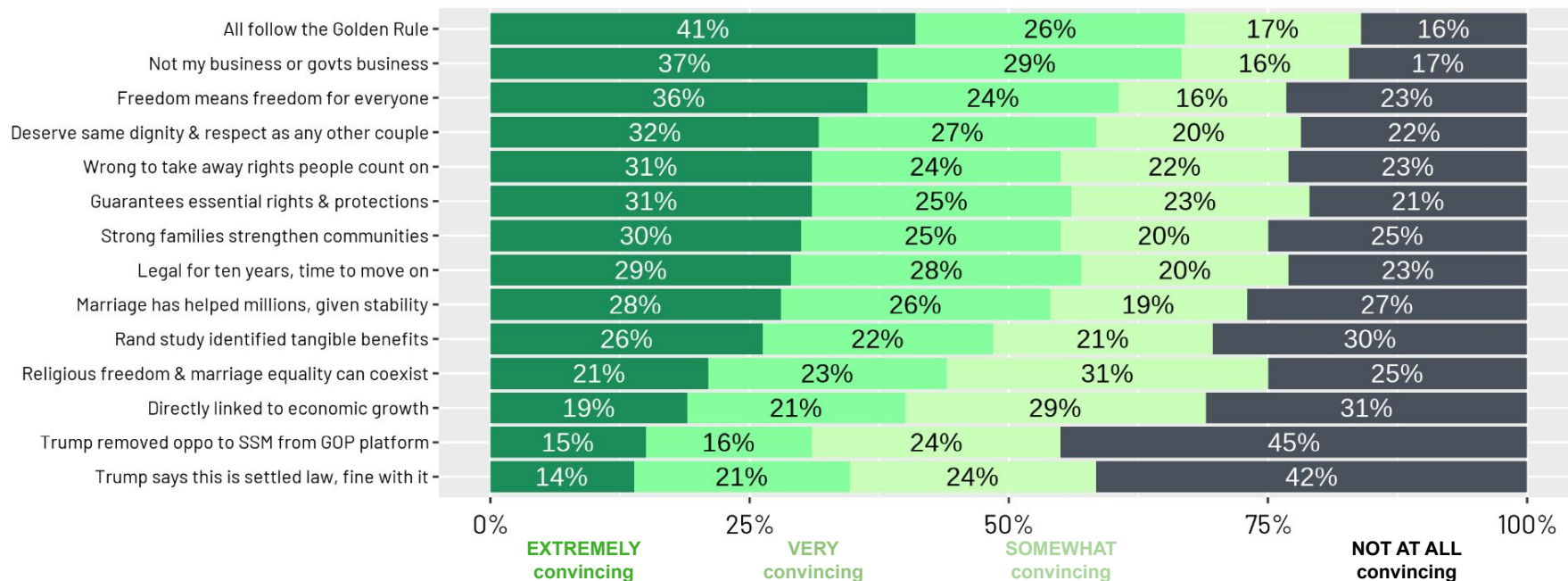

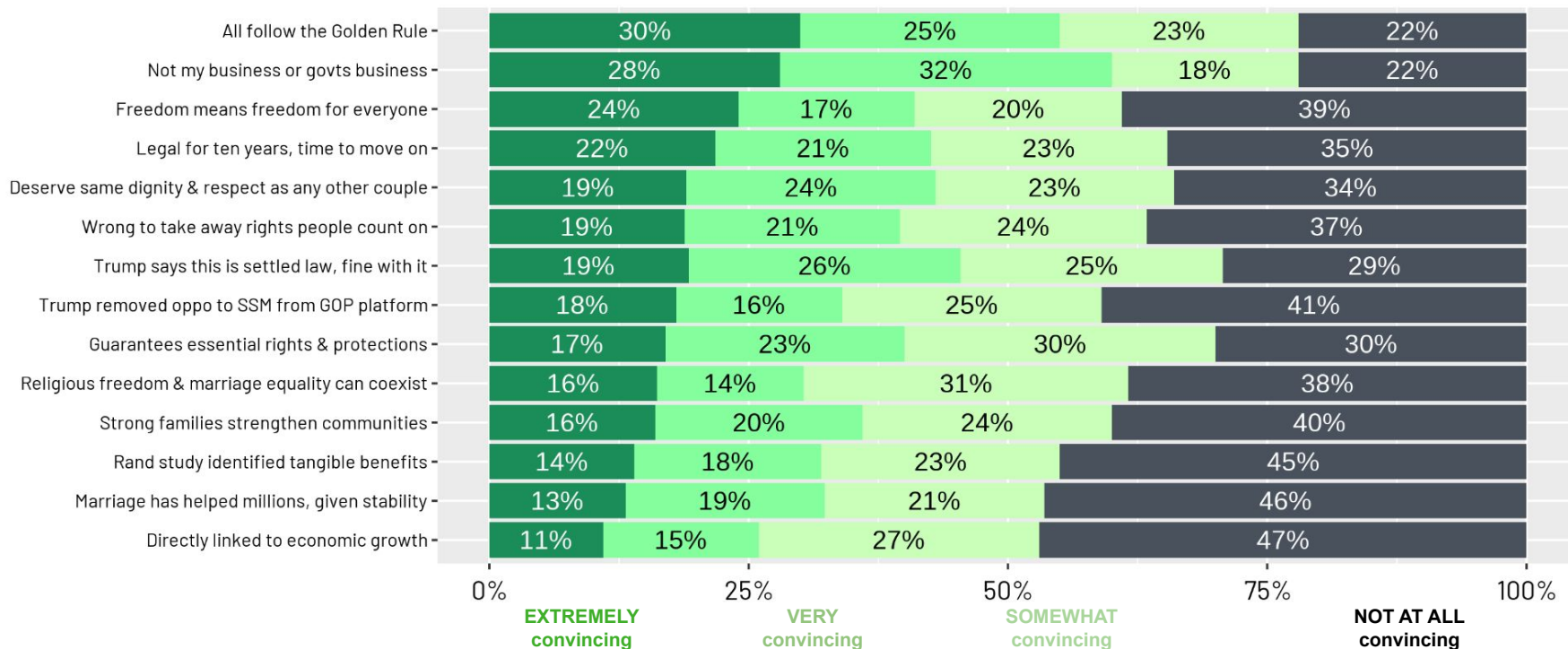

Among Republican Voters Trump Messaging Also Does Well

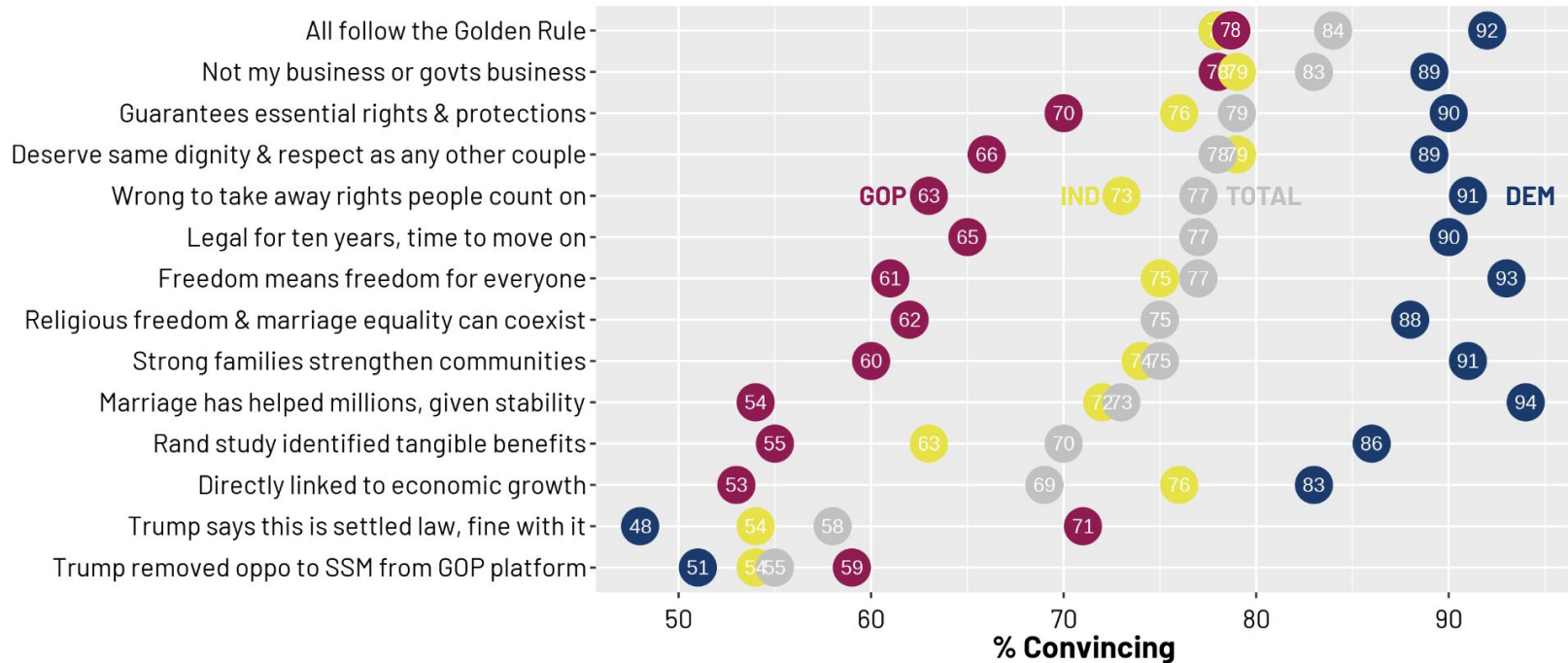
GOP Only: Reactions to Pro-SSM Messaging



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A Majority of GOP Find ALL of These Messages Convincing

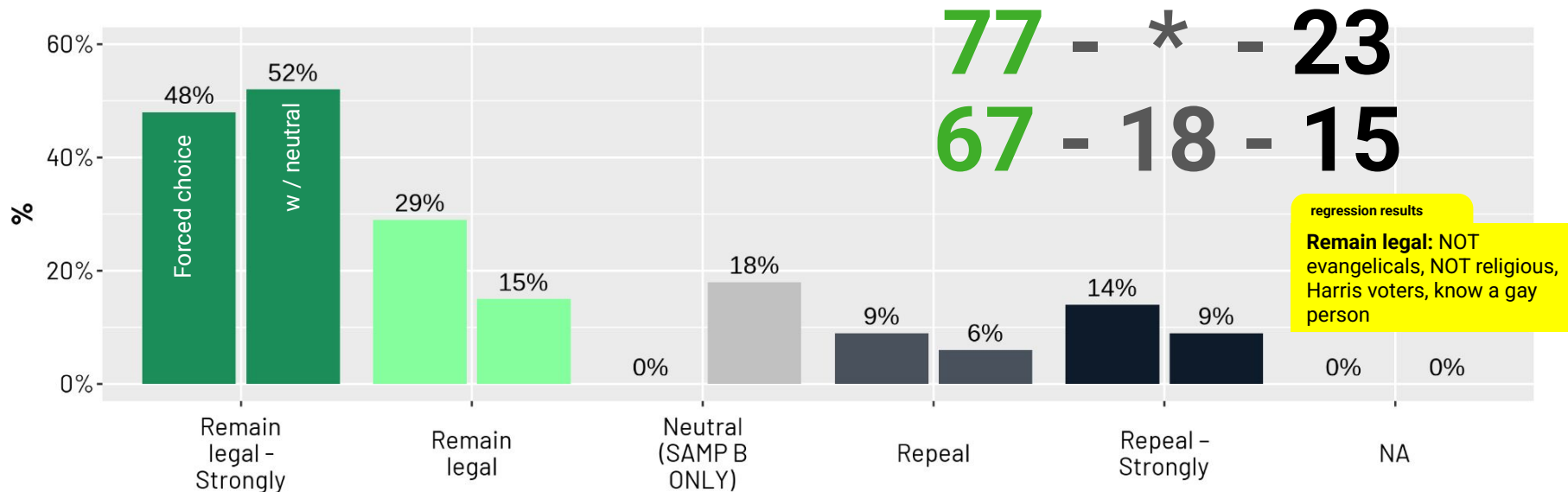
Pro-SSM Messages % Convincing by Party



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After Messaging Support Gets as High as 77% for Keeping Same Sex Marriage Legal

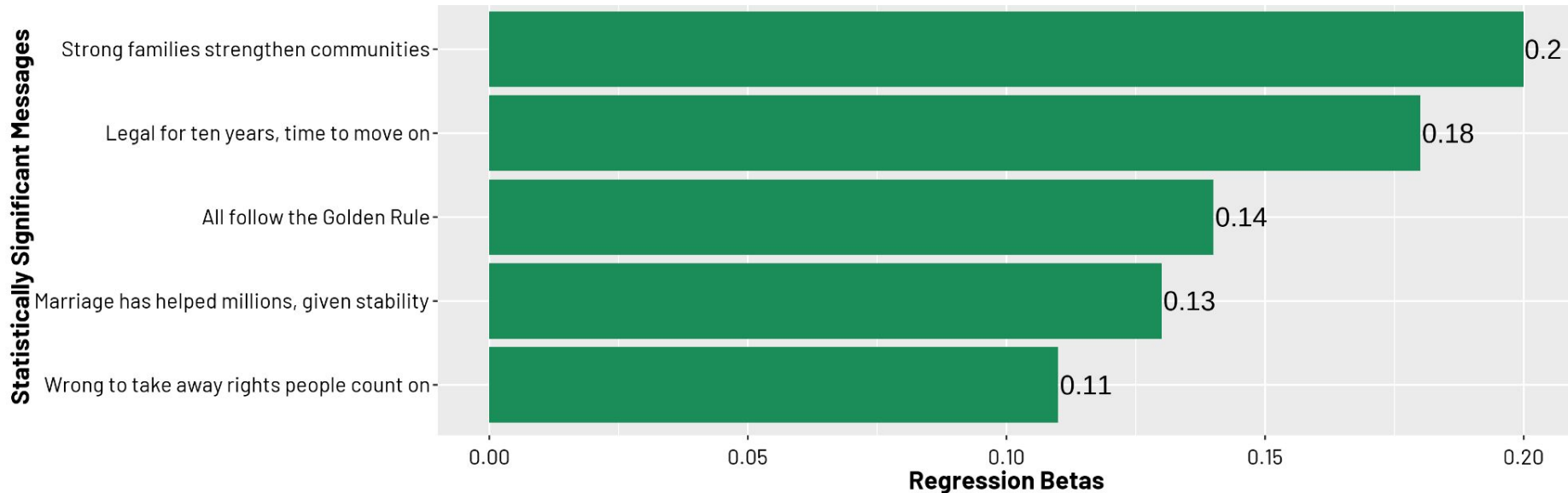
Post Messaging SSM Attitudes - Repeal or Keep?



As you've seen in this survey, same-sex marriage has been legal throughout the United States for ten years. There are now seven hundred eighty-one thousand married same-sex households according to the US Census. Regardless of how you initially felt, do you think same-sex marriage should remain legal, or should it be repealed?

Emphasizing Settled Law & Taking Rights Away Helps Sway Hesitant Voters

Messages most likely to move voters



Stepwiseregression of all messaging variables on the post ballot while controlling for pre-messaging ballot

1. A decade after the landmark Obergefell decision, **support for same sex marriage is strong, stable, and settled** in the minds of the American public.
2. Despite recent legislative challenges, approximately **7 out of 10 Americans are satisfied with the legal status** of same-sex marriage.
3. Same-sex marriage has transitioned from a divisive political issue to an **accepted social norm**: 44% see it as a good thing for society, another 31% say it has been neither good nor bad.
4. **A majority of Republicans approve of the Respect for Marriage Act**. Without neutral options, we consistently see about half of Republicans supporting SSM, and 63% of Republicans believe you can be a Republican AND support SSM.
5. The energy on this issue lies almost entirely with its supporters, leaving opponents with no advantages, as demonstrated by **an importance gap, an intensity gap, and a conversion gap**.
6. Continued increases in support for same-sex marriage have primarily been driven by **Interactions with same-sex couples, gay friends and neighbors**.
7. **Conservative messaging works**: Freedom- and faith-based frames are powerful tools for reinforcing support, particularly within the GOP. President Trump's position also helps.
8. Messages reinforcing this as a **settled issue are particularly persuasive**, e.g. it has been legal for ten years and it is time to move on, or that it is wrong to take away rights that people have come to count on.
9. The data suggests **attempts to relitigate same sex marriage would face significant opposition** across the political spectrum, including among Republicans.
